



Vice Chairman's Corner By George Heissenberger


Happy motoring to you! As I write this column my son is installing a new radio in his 1975 Dodge Dart Swinger. He is installing one of the "Retro Sound" audio heads that appear to be a vintage MOPAR AM style radio as seen in the dash but in fact his new radio has Bluetooth, AM/FM stereo, input for smart phone

and can play Sirius, Pandora or Spotify streaming radio. The size of the old AM radio he pulled out is easily 3X the size of the unit that he is installing, although they look similar when installed in the dash. I'm sure the heat output will be 3X smaller too! I am still rocking a 1970's vintage Craig AM/FM Cassette radio that was in the MGB when we bought it George from Haynes in 1983, and I believe the radio was installed by a college female student prior to his ownership.

Whoever installed it cut a too big hole in

the console and butchered up one side, so I obtained a "new" console from British Auto soon after buying the car intending to replace it, but here it is 39 years later, and the "new" console is still in my parts bin and not on the car. The knob cover plates mostly cover the damage. I rarely use the radio anyways, except most often in the late fall or early spring when the hardtop is on and you can actually hear the two 6" x 9" oval speakers mounted on the back bulkhead behind the folded soft top. Sound is decent and the reception is good for AM or FM. I used to use the cassette occasionally and had a few 1970's cassette tapes in the

glove box. I haven't used the cassette in years, because the last time I tried it, it ate the Beatles cassette I had used for years. The unnerving thing about the Craig cassette deck is that when you put the cassette tape in the player, and press play, it drops the cassette down into the unit to play. Except when it doesn't



would rather hear the engine sounds anyway and don't rely on the radio for entertainment. Plus, when the hardtop is off, the top is down and the radio is audible only when all the way up and by then the distortion is pretty bad so you get a muffled sound at best. What about you? What do you use for a radio? Do you have a radio or just listen to the engine? Let me know next time we meet!

MG-Powered British Specialist Sportscars

I recently acquired a book titled "British Specialist Cars 1945-60", by Chris Rees. It covers the amazing array

of small volume, mostly fiberglass body manufactured cars made in the UK during this period. In reading through the book, the MGpowered ones were my greatest interest.

My interest in learning more about these unusual sportscars all started around 2016 after we purchased our 1955 MGZA Magnette for my Dad. That summer. Dad and I enjoyed going to a number of car shows with the Magnette and black mv MGA. Typically, I would have both cars at my house, give them a wash and chamois dry on Saturday evening, and then have them ready to go when my Dad arrived early Sunday morning. Before our MGCC show that year, I happened to have a few

minutes in the morning before he arrived, so I started both cars and let them warm up for 5 minutes in the

driveway. I found it to be very amusing that such different cars were both making what is to my ears are "MGA sounds" (since the Magnette uses essentially an MGA 1500 engine). After that, I got wondering what else used the 'BMC B-series' engine. A list I prepared totaled about 26 cars using MGA engines, and 8 using MGB engines. The list includes many mundane saloon cars and a few small commercial trucks (and one boat), but the specialist sportscars looked more interesting!

The specialist world really picked up momentum in the UK in the very early 1950s with the creation of

fiberglass bodies to fit on postwar British Ford Populars, Morris 8s, and early Austin chassis and

running gear. Some of the kits were crude: for the instance. owner/builder had to cut out the doors, bootlid, and bonnet from the shell. The resulting cars were often poorly built and had nearly the same abominable performance as the worn-out donor car.

However, things as progressed, some higher quality and more thoroughly engineered cars appeared on the scene that could be purchased complete with new chassis and modern suspensions and full interiors for home assembly to avoid Purchase Tax. First and foremost. I have to mention the names! While many small

manufacturers used initials or portions of the creators' names, there were some outstanding car names as

well: who wouldn't want to own an Edwards Brothers (EB) Debonair? Or a Tornado Typhoon or Tornado Talisman?


From here, I will concentrate on (3) of these producers that used the BMC B-series (MGA/B) engines:

The first and probably most well-known is TVR. The launch of the Grantura around 1959-60

featured a choice between a small Ford UK engine, a racing but temperamental Coventry Climax engine, or an MGA 1500 engine.

These early TVRs featured a Volkswagen torsion bar suspension and a super-short wheelbase with short doors making getting in-and-out a chore, and a buckboard ride. Between bankruptcies (yes, several) TVR settled down and upgraded to the MGA 1588, 1622, and then eventually the MGB 1798 3-main, then 5-main engines by 1965. One technical highlight: TVR was probably the most prolific user of the HRG Derrington aluminum crossflow head for the MGA/B engines. Also, TVRs were often fitted with The one that really caught my eye recently is the Rochdale Olympic. The outstanding feature of this small coupe is that the main bodyshell is a <u>full fiberglass monocoque</u> construction, with molded in steel sub-frames for front suspension and engine mounts, and rear suspension. It arrived on the scene in 1959, about two years after the ground-breaking Lotus Elite (Type 14) was introduced as the first full fiberglass monocoque construction. The Rochdale Olympic was extensively tested over 30,000 miles of

the MGA close-ratio gearboxes during this period. Both of these modifications (the 'good stuff') notably improved

performance! Front vertical links and brakes were Healey 100-6/3000 initially, then switching to Spitfire and GT-6 by 1963. It is believed that 400+ Granturas were produced, most with MG power. By 1967 the car evolved into the Vixen with a move to Ford 1600 power. I am skipping the chapter on the 289-powered Ford Griffith here, but it is

is widely agreed that the Rochdale product overcame manv of the structural shortcomings of the Lotus. Rochdale, based in the town of Rochdale outside of industrial Manchester, had been a successful builder of highquality fiberglass bodies with the Rochdale GT probably the most

rough roads, and it

an exciting chapter as well.

The second is Elva Courier. The Courier was introduced in 1958 as a roadster with the MGA 1500 engine, and this car also evolved through the MGA 1588 and 1622, and then to both MGB versions before production wound down at the end of 1964. This included the early roadsters with side screens, then the coupes (see Spokes, July 2020) and finally the Mk IV convertible model with wind up windows courtesy of using the doors from the newly introduced Triumph Spitfire. A few of the last ~100 Couriers were UK Ford powered. Again, the front suspension migrated to the Triumph Spitfire design starting with the MK III cars of 1962-3. About 610 total Couriers of all types were produced. famous. Interestingly, the Olympic was named when the design team was at a Fall 1959 design review meeting, and no one could agree on a name. Someone mentioned the preparation work for the upcoming 1960 Olympics and suddenly that became the name for the new car.

Mechanically, the Olympic Phase I models used Riley 1.5 running gear: the uprated torsion bar suspension and drum brakes that the Riley had inherited from the Morris Minor, the Riley rear axle, and also the Riley 1.5 (again, MGA 1500) engine. The Riley 1.5 itself was very much a then-current offering, so the lighter and nimbler Olympic was really an up-to-the-minute sportscar. The front-end styling is incredibly like a Porsche 356 of the era, while the rear looks somewhat

like a smaller Jaguar E-type coupe. As it transpires, chief designer Richard Parker's father ran a Porsche 356 as his everyday car. Following a devastating nighttime factory fire in 1961 where thankfully no one was hurt, production subsequently restarted with the

(gaining nice geometry and compact lighter weight disc brakes suitable for these lighter weight cars), and once the Ford 1500 pre-crossflow and then the Ford 1600 crossflow head engines became available, to move rapidly and permanently in that direction.

Phase II model featuring a generous rear hatch, and a conversion to UK Ford 1500cc power and front Spitfire suspension. It is estimated that 350-400 total Olympics were produced. There seem to be a few over here in the USA (Phase I and Phase II) according to the club.

Looking across these (3) specialist makers, one can see a real trend. In the 1958-64 timeframe they heavily used BMC components, especially engines, front

It is interesting that some of the most successful specialist sportscars in the UK during this time period all used BMC or MG mechanical components. Today, gives MG it enthusiasts some interesting and unusual choices. while still maintaining familiar mechanical components under the bonnet.

A future article will look at some of the

suspensions and rear differentials or full axles. However, it really appears that the 'hot ticket' was to migrate to Triumph Spitfire front suspension

more successful BMC A-series powered specialist cars such as the Turner Sports, the Mini-based Unipower GT, and others.


